The Angel Harps mission is to provide physically and emotionally challenged individuals with the opportunity to heal through harp therapy--and to promote the health and strength of a community by addressing the physical and emotional needs of the less fortunate in low income areas.

In 2005, Woodley's Angel Harps organization donated their first harp to a child with Down's syndrome. Today, Angel Harps continues to donate harps to schools and to those people who can provide special needs children with access to harp music therapy.

National and local businesses have lent their financial support to Angel Harps. The organization's annual benefit concert is a favorite activity in Chula Vista and ninety- five percent of all proceeds raised go toward the purchase of harps for special needs children.
